- Have you ever been fired from a job? Why?
- Why are you looking for a job?
- If hired, how would you describe the key elements of measuring your performance?
- When did you decide on a broadcasting career?
- Can you work under deadlines and pressure?
- What questions do you have about the company?
- What challenges are you looking for from the company?
- Do you consider yourself competitive at work?
- What would you define as the biggest challenge? How did you over-come it.
- What would your previous/current employer say is your strongest point? Weakest?
- What disappointed you about previous/current job?
- Tell me the one thing I should know about you now that I will find out in 6 months?
- Why do you want to work here?
- Would former co-workers tell us that you focused on your goals, of the companies?
- Describe a situation where you were responsible for leading a team.
- What do you read?
- Why do you think you would do well at this job?
- Are you currently employed? If not, why?
- What are your expectations from the company?
- Tell me about a time you went out of your way to complete a task.
- Tell me about a challenge you faced and how did you dealt with it.
